The Department of Curriculum & Teaching in the School of Education at The University of Kansas (KU) is seeking a tenure track Assistant Professor in Curriculum Studies. This 9-month, tenure-track position will begin on August 18, 2018. The Department of Curriculum and Teaching is committed to support a culture of inclusion for all students.
